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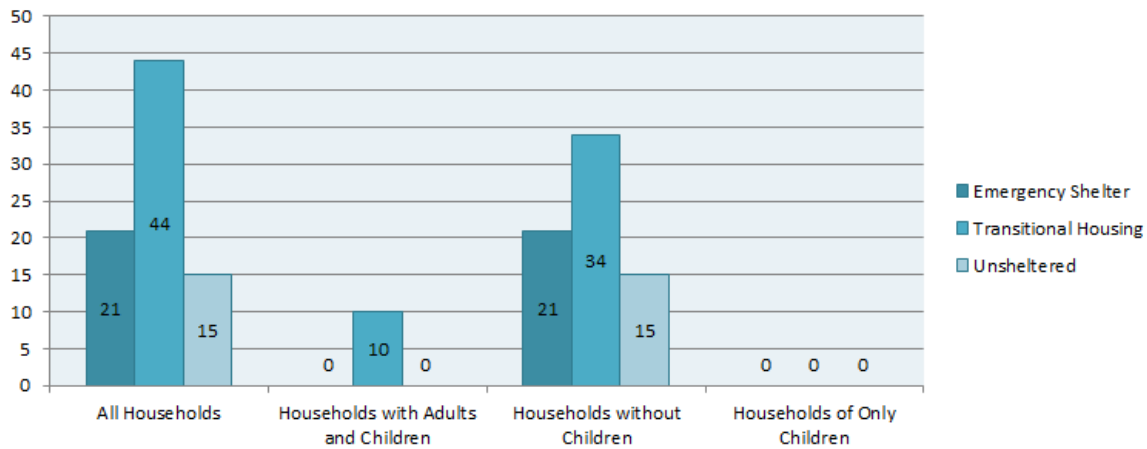

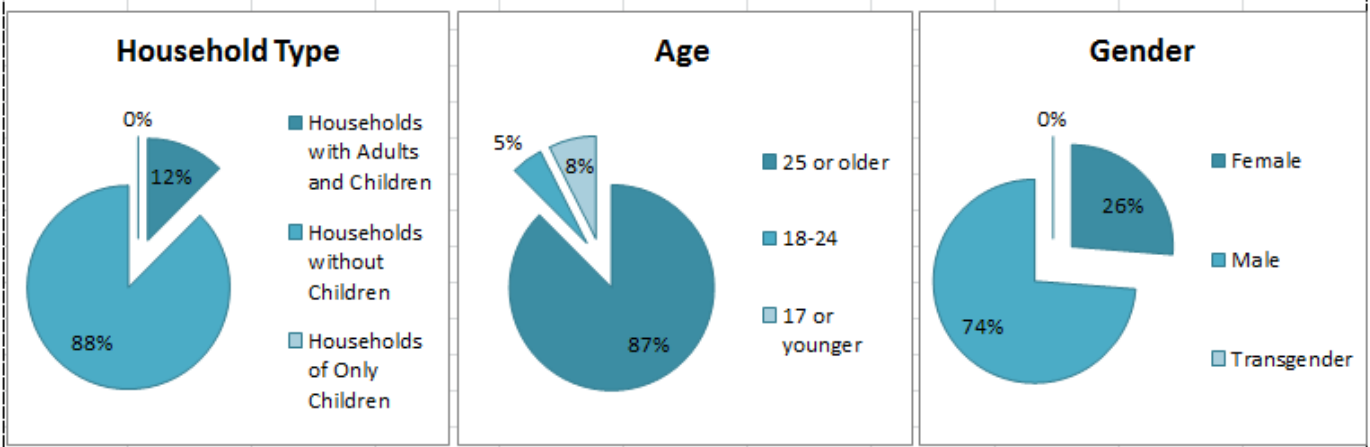
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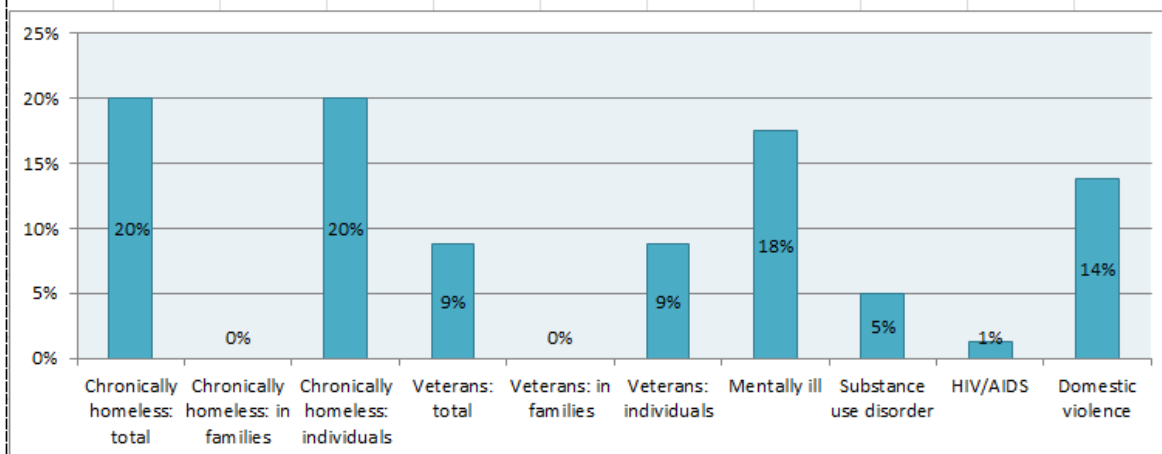
2016 Homeless Count by Living Situation



2016 Homeless Count Demographics



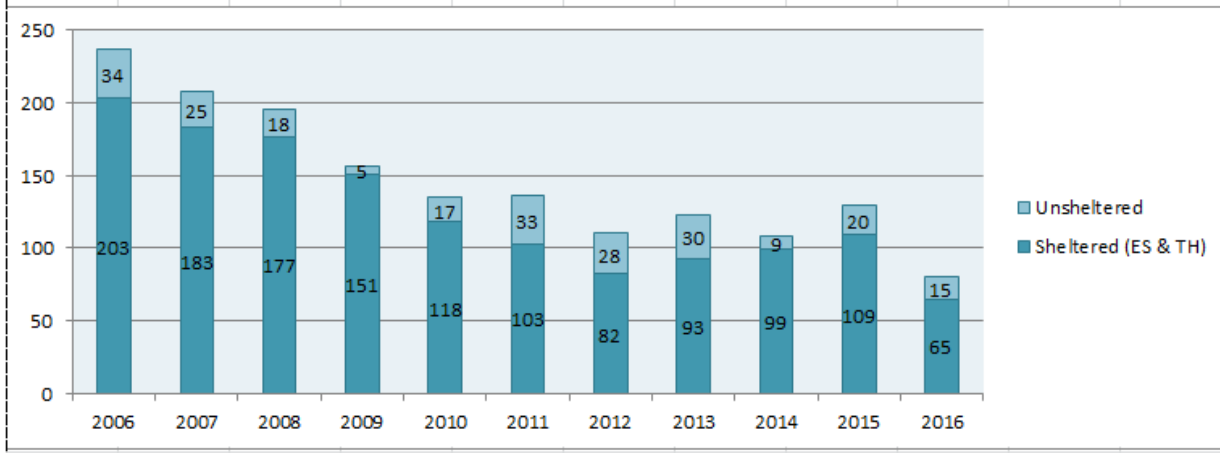
2016 Homeless Count Subpopulations



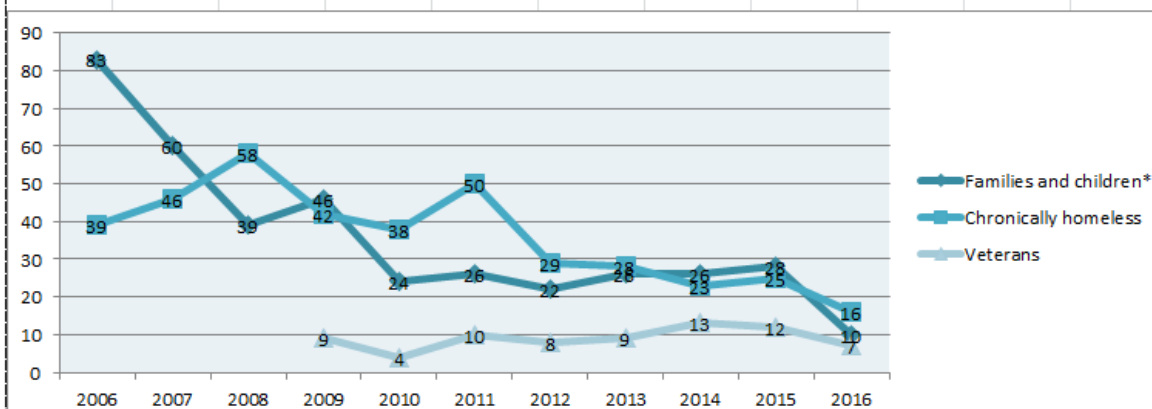
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Homelessness Over Last 10 Years: by Living Situation

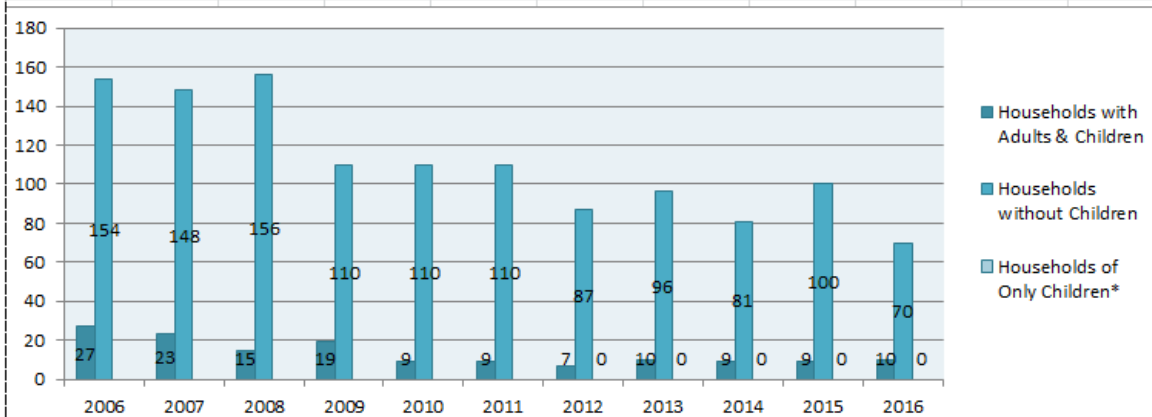


Homelessness Over Last 10 Years: Target Populations
