I am contacting you regarding the vacant Relief Fund Board Trustee position on the Carrboro Fire-Rescue Department Relief Fund Board.

I have been a resident in the Carrboro Fire-Rescue district for over seventy years. I live on Lacock Road, as I have for most of my life, on land that has been in my family since 1909. I joined the Army in 1962 and was honorably discharged in 1968. Following my military service, I served the Carrboro Fire-Rescue Department in various roles for thirty three years, both as a volunteer and professional member. I worked my way through the ranks starting at the rank of Firefighter in 1968 and retiring in 2001 at the rank of Deputy Fire Chief. One of my roles with the Carrboro Fire-Rescue Department was to serve as an administrator for the Carrboro firefighter's organization, a private organization which laid the foundation for the Relief Fund Board as it exists today. I was a founding member and board member of the South Orange Rescue Squad located in Carrboro. I served with the South Orange Rescue Squad from 1971 through 1976. I have been active in the community as a part of several additional civic organizations. I am an active attendee of Antioch Baptist Church, and have served on committees and in groups as a part of my attendance at Antioch as well as through my membership with Damascus United Methodist Church.

Given my history of service to the Town of Carrboro, the Carrboro Fire-Rescue Department, and the community as a whole I would make an excellent addition to the Relief Fund Board. I take the responsibility of civic involvement seriously, and would appreciate the opportunity to give back to the community, and the Fire-Rescue Department, as a member of the Relief Fund Board.
