

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWN MANAGER TO SELECT A CONTRACTOR AND EXECUTE A CONTRACT FOR THE INSTALLATION OF BICYCLE DETECTION SYSTEM AT SIGNALIZED INTERSECTIONS (TIP# U-4726DF)

WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro, has received \$30,000 from the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) under the federal Surface Transportation Program-Direct Attributable (STP-DA) program for the design and construction of Bicycle Loop Detectors; and,

WHEREAS, on December 6, 2022, the Town Council of the Town of Carrboro authorized staff to submit a TIP amendment to the Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) to allocate \$120,000 of federal Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGDA) local discretionary funds to the project in order to complete construction; and

WHEREAS, on October 24, 2023, the Town Council adopted a Capital Project Ordinance amendment to increase the project budget to \$157,500, including \$31,500 of local match; and,

WHEREAS, on May 16, 2024, the Town advertised the Bicycle Detection at Signalized Intersection Project (TIP# U-4726DF) to install bicycle loop detectors at the following four signalized intersections: East Main Street at Roberson Street, Main Street at North Greensboro Street, Weaver Street at North Greensboro Street, and NC 54 at West Poplar Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the bid opening is scheduled for June 13th; the Town will select the lowest responsible bidder, subject to NCDOT concurrence, to be awarded the contract for installation of bicycle detection system.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Carrboro, North Carolina as follows:

Section 1. The Carrboro Town Council authorizes the Town Manager to select and execute a contract for the installation of bicycle detection systems to the lowest responsible bidder in the amount not to exceed \$138,975.

Section 2. Within five (5) days after this resolution is adopted, the Town Clerk shall file a copy of this resolution with the Finance Director.

Section 3. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.
