
### Traffic Stop Policy Review In Process

- Data what do we see?
  - Policy creation overview model policy template safety focus
    - Speed and safety related stops as % of total stops increase
    - Equipment/regulatory stop as % are down
    - Disparities increase or decrease per quarter inconsistent
    - Type of charge and type of sanction are generally consistent
- Process
  - Internal review of policy specifics change April 1<sup>st</sup> (new quarter)
  - Training of all department members in race and equity decision making
  - Internal consultation with Town Race and Equity staff
  - External
    - Contacted four community organizations for comments and feedback
      - NAACP, El Centro, ACLU, Refugee Community Partnership
    - Center for Policing Equity (CPE)
      - Policy and data analysis and recommendations




## Roadway Demographics

Q2 2023 – Q4 2024




### Carrboro Demographics 2020 Census















- Policy Violation Sustained





## **Diversion Social Worker Update**







- Average caseload of 9.5 a month since April 2024
- 16 total individuals for the year of 2024 on the Carrboro Police Department case load
- 85 individual interactions for 2024 year
- Attend community meetings on behalf of both entities (CCDR and Carrboro)
- Case management and respond to other towns if client is in crisis with other police departments or C.A.R.E. Team.

- 49 Carrboro community member interactions via coresponse, referral, police reports, and IFC referrals for 2024
- Partnerships:
- C.I.T. Presentation at Caramore with Lt. Deshaies
- Willow Creek Laundromat: DSW receives clean donations of clothing and distribute as needed.
- Southeast Raleigh Promise: Receive limited number of bus passes for identified individuals. The bus passes are intended to connect to services throughout the Triangle.

## Diversion Social Worker Update

#### **Carrboro PD Resource Referral**



- 50% Housed
- 40% Unhoused
- 10% Unknown

- Easily accessible QR code on printed cards.
- Carrboro Officers refer community members for various connections
  - 9 referrals so far in 2025
- Resource options range from career and finance counseling, mental health connections, and veteran connections.





## **Diversion Social Worker Update**

#### **Client "H" Success Story:**

 Providing support and working with clients and community resources towards stability.

#### In the Works:

- Mental Health Kits (Adults)
- Therapeutic Bear Bags (for all officers to have)
- Parent Night Out
- Middle school Summer Camp w/ SROs and volunteers
- Second crisis position –
   embed with Chapel Hill CARE
   Team and/or co-response





## Key Takeaways

- Safety-related stops are priority and significant majority of overall stops review in process
- Approximately 50% of traffic stops end with a warning or no action.
- Complaints are low in number (2).
- Instances of Use of Force are low (9) and types of force used is low.
- Diversion & Deflection 45% officer deflection rate this quarter for low-level crimes
- Diversion Social Worker is engaging community members and continuing to develop additional options and programs
- Grant funding situation has changed
