34	WHEREAS, January 2022 m	arks the 20th anniversary of Nation	nal Mentoring Month, an		
35	annual campaign to focus attention on the need for mentors and on how each of us can work				
36	to increase the number of men	ntors to help ensure positive outcome	mes for young people;		

- 37 WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro honors volunteer mentors who support young people by
- 38 showing up for them every day and demonstrating their commitment to helping them thrive;
- 39 and
- 40 WHEREAS, mentoring programs like MENTOR North Carolina and the Chapel Hill-
- 41 Carrboro City Schools Blue Ribbon Mentor-Advocate program make our communities
- 42 stronger by driving impactful relationships that increase social capital for young people and
- 43 provide invaluable support networks; and
- WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, mentoring programs have stepped up to fill
- 45 gaps for young people and families, connecting them with resources and ensuring that
- 46 mentoring relationships continue virtually to ensure that physical distancing does not mean
- 47 social disconnection; and
- WHEREAS, mentoring plays a pivotal role in career exploration and supports workplace
- skills by helping young people set career goals, equips mentors with the skills they need to
- support the professional growth of young people, and drives positive outcomes for young
- 51 people and businesses; and
- 52 WHEREAS, quality mentoring promotes healthy relationships and communication, positive
- self-esteem, emotional well-being, and growth of young people and their relationships with
- 54 other adults: and
- 55 WHEREAS, students who meet regularly with mentors are more than 52 percent less likely
- than their peers to skip a day of school, and youth who face an opportunity gap but have a
- 57 mentor are 55 percent more likely to be enrolled in college than those who did not have a
- 58 mentor; and
- 59 WHEREAS, youth who meet regularly with their mentors are 46 percent less likely than their
- peers to start using drugs and 27 percent less likely to start drinking; and
- 61 WHEREAS, almost half of adults today report having a mentor in their youth, and those rates
- appear to have been rising steadily over the past several decades, and
- WHEREAS, National Mentoring Month is a time of year to celebrate, elevate, and encourage
- 64 mentoring across our state and recruit caring adult mentors in Carrboro;
