WHEREAS, on April 30, 2015, the Town of Carrboro received an offer from New Media Campaign Corporation to purchase the Property for a purchase price of \$548,825.00; and

WHEREAS, the proposed transaction is subject to the negotiated offer, advertisement and upset bid requirements of Article 12 of Chapter 160A of the North Carolina General Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town of Carrboro Board of Aldermen this the 5TH day of May, 2015 as follows:

1.The Town of Carrboro Board of Aldermen proposes to accept New Media Campaign Corporation's bid to purchase the Property for the purchase price of \$548,825.00;

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- 2.The Town Clerk shall, upon receipt from the Purchaser of a deposit equal to five percent (5%) of the purchase offer amount, publish the notice required by North Carolina General Statutes Section 160A-269 with respect to the offer;
- 3.The Town shall thereupon proceed with the upset bid process established by North Carolina General Statutes Section 160A-269 until no further qualifying upset bids are received, at which time the Town Board of Aldermen may accept the offer and sell the property to the highest bidder.

REPORT ON THE DURHAM-ORANGE LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT PROJECT (D-O LRT)

The purpose of this item was for the Board of Aldermen to receive an update on the project and provide input on five alternatives related to the project

Patrick McDonough, Planning Director with GoTriangle, presented the information to the Board.

Alderman Seils asked for staff to schedule an agenda item for the Board to discuss submitting written comments to GoTriangle during the early portion of September.

<u>CONTINUATION OF PUBLIC HEARING ON THE CONDITIONAL USE DISTRICT</u> REZONING AND CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR 501 SOUTH GREENSBORO STREET

Continuation of the public hearing on applications for an M-3-conditional use rezoning (M-3-CU) and a conditional use permit (CUP) to allow for the construction of a three- to four- building commercial development on property located at 501 South Greensboro Street, also known the former Rogers-Triem site.

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All speakers listed below were sworn in by the Town Clerk

Tina Moon, the Town's Planning Administrator, made the staff report.

Jeff Kleaveland, the Town's Zoning and Planning Development Specialist, answered questions from the Board. Runyon Woods and Hannah Byrum, representing the applicant, Woodhill, INC LLC, also provided responses to the questions.

In response to a question regarding native plantings, a representative from Bland Landscaping Company, told the Board that only native species or non-invasive species would be used to landscape.

Alderman Gist expressed concern with the noise ordinance not covering businesses that have noises that spill over into residential neighborhoods.

Scott Clark, the traffic engineer from Davenport and Ashton Smith, a civil engineer spoke to the Board regarding the flooding of the trailers across form the proposed development. They discussed that the improvements that the developer is making will not address the four trailers that are affected by backwater flooding from the culvert but that it will help stormwater runoff.

Sharon Collins, a resident that lives across the street from proposed development, stated that they have not been approached to sell a portion of their property (related to right-of-way and roundabout construction) but that they were approached to provide the property without compensation. She expressed concern with additional stormwater runoff from Park Slope. She also expressed concern with the roundabout being located on a hill.

Robert Joyner, a resident of Roberson Place, read conditions the community has requested from the developer.

Tommy Koonce, a neighbor of the proposed development discussed concerns with sightlines and noise. He asked that the developer provide additional screening to protect his property. Mr. Woods stated that he would be happy to work with Mr. Koonce to establish additional plantings on the Koonce's property. Nick Herman, the Town's Attorney, stated that this matter would is a private property issue between the developer and Mr. Koonce.

Lisa Hazirjian, a resident of Roberson Place, stated that she is concerned with the possibility of increased noise associated with patrons leaving the location late at night. She also asked that the residential neighborhood be protected from rodents that are attracted to trash.

Staff will work to amend the conditions, especially regarding the discussion of the neighbors points, the driveway and screening assistance for Sharon Collins, the additional screening assistance for the Koonce's, delivery locations and times, and a way to work the performance standards into conditions.

George Seiz, the Town's Public Works Director, was sworn in and provided the Town's solid

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waste pickup schedules.

Robert Joyner requested that the Roberson Street HOA be contacted and provided a chance to review the conditions prior to the meeting. Staff agreed to provide the information to the HOA in advance of the next meeting.

Alderman Gist asked the developer to make sure roundabout is moved to not affect the property owners.

THE CONDITIONS SHOULD BE PROVIDED TO THE BOARD SHOWN DIVIDED BASED ON SOURCE OF REQUEST. VOTE: AFFIRMATIVE ALL
