CARRBORO POLICE APPRECIATION DAY

Sherri Ontjez, a Carrboro resident, stated that she would like to have a Carrboro Police Appreciation Day. Shari stated that she will plan the event and work with the Chief to coordinate schedules.

CARRBORO BICYCLE COALITION – REQUEST FOR ACTION

Charlie Hileman, a member of the Carrboro Bicycle Coalition, stated that traffic signals don't change when bikes are stopped and stated that the lights at Weaver Street needs to be calibrated. He asked if calibration does not work, that the lights should be placed on a timed loop. He stated that the Coalition is working to get bike parking and asked that businesses be required to allocate parking for Cyclists and asked the Town to require businesses to have more bike parking.

HUMAN SERVICES ADVISORY COMMISSION FUNDING RECOMMENDATIONS

The purpose of this item was for the Board of Aldermen to consider approving the Human Services Advisory Commission's funding recommendations for fiscal year 2015-16.

Alderman Seils stated that he is concerned with reducing the Community Empowerment Fund.

Alderman Haven-O'Donnell asked that next year the item show how much funding is being received from other jurisdictions.

Alderman Slade asked for a brief explanation from the Human Services Chair regarding the rationale for funding recommendations next year.

Alderman Chaney suggested using funds from the Affordable Housing Funds to fund Habitat for Humanity of Orange County and Rebuilding Together of the Triangle, Inc. and to use the offset funds from the Human Services Funding to increase funding amounts of Community Empowerment Fund by \$500.00 for a total funding of \$2,000.

MOTION WAS MADE BY ALDERMAN SEILS, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN JOHNSON TO APPROVE THE RESOLUTION, AS DIRECTED ABOVE:

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE HUMAN SERVICES ADVISORY COMMISSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015-16 HUMAN SERVICES FUNDING

WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro established as a policy to support human services agencies that provide invaluable services to Carrboro citizens; and

WHEREAS, Fifty-two (52) agencies applied for funding through the established Human Services funding process; and

WHEREAS, the Human Services Advisory Commission has met with all applicants that applied for funding in the 2015-16 funding cycle; and

WHEREAS, the town staff indicated that the human services funding level for fiscal year 2015-16 is \$220,000.00, which represents a 10% increase over last year's funding of \$200,000; and

WHEREAS, the total amount of funding requests for 2015-16 was \$324,000.00.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CARRBORO MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN RESOLVE THAT:

Section 1. Subject to approval of the FY 2015-16 Budget, \$220,000.00 will be allocated to Human Services.

Section 2. That the Human Services Advisory Commission have heard the requests from the applicants and are making a final recommendation for allocation of the available funds to agencies.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Carrboro Board of Aldermen approve the recommendation for funding by the Human Services Advisory Commission with the following modifications:

a.Funding for the Community Empowerment Fund Program is increased from \$1,500.00 to \$2,000.00.

<u>A REQUEST TO SET A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE TEMPORARY STREET CLOSING</u> PERMIT APPLICATION FOR THE NOT SO NORMAL RUN FESTIVAL

The purpose of this item was to set a public hearing for a Street Closing Permit Application submitted by Hairy Pony Racing Association for the temporary closing and usage of streets from 7:00 AM to 2:00 PM on Sunday, April 3rd, 2016 to accommodate the *Not So Normal Run Festival*, which includes a half marathon race and a full marathon race.

A RESOLUTION SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING ON TEMPORARY STREET CLOSING PERMIT TO ACCOMMODATE A HALF MARATHON AND FULL MARATHON FOR THE NOT SO NORMAL RUN FESTIVAL

- Section 1. On the day of the event, public streets shall be temporarily used Sunday, April 3rd, 2016 from 7:00 AM to 2:00 PM to accommodate half marathon and full marathon races for the Not So Normal Run Festival. This event is to be held in accordance with the permit issued by the Board of Aldermen pursuant to Article III of Chapter 7 of the Town Code. Refer to attached maps for exact locations of streets being used for the event.
- Section 2. The Town shall supply the appropriate traffic control devices to give notice of the temporary traffic controls.
- Section 3. No person may operate any vehicle contrary to the traffic control devices installed in accordance with Section 2 of this resolution.

- Section 4. Applicant shall distribute flyers of notification, to persons occupying property abutting the streets where the event is to take place, of the contents of any resolution passed.
- Section 5. Applicant will be responsible for all costs incurred by Police and Public Works to facilitate this event. Applicant will be sent an itemized bill for the final costs incurred by Police and Public Works.
- Section 6. The scope of this event will require staffing that exceeds what the Public Works and Police Departments can typically provide, and subsequently the coordinator will be hiring additional professional staff to help manage the event. Town staff will help coordinate the traffic control. The applicant must provide additional labor for areas of the race courses outside the Town of Carrboro jurisdiction limits, and hiring additional forces for areas in Town limits beyond what Carrboro Police and Public Works are able to staff.
- Section 7. The Event Coordinator will be responsible for notifying Central Communications when the street is closed and when it is reopened to vehicular traffic.
- Section 8. This resolution is contingent on the applicant providing proper liability insurance to the Town at least 30 days prior the event.
- Section 9. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

Summary of Designated Fund Balance Budget Items

Arts Committee – The Arts Committee has unexpended budget funds remaining and requests they be reserved for use in the upcoming year.

CD & Memorabilia - The CD & Memorabilia Show is held twice a year and is self-supporting. Funds remaining after expenses each year are carried over.

Car Seat Sales – The Fire Department in past years received a grant to purchase and install car seats on a sliding fee scale. Funding to continue this program comes from earned revenues and carryover of unspent budget funds from year to year.

OWASA Subsidy – The unspent portion of the OWASA sewer subsidy budget is reserved annually until spent entirely.

Parking Study – The Planning Department will be undertaking a study of parking needs in the Town that will yield a comprehensive parking plan. An RFP is in the process of being refined and should be issued by summer.

Seizure Funds – The Police Department uses these restricted revenues to supplement ongoing investigations. Unexpended funds in any given year are carried over to the next year.

Narcotics Funds - The Police Departments requests that unexpended narcotic funds for undercover investigations be carried over to the next fiscal year.

Solid Waste Pay As You Throw Study – This study will be designed as a comprehensive one rather than the initial goal of focusing on "pay as you throw". An RFP may be developed and issued to select a firm for this study.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon confirmation of the actual amount for the above projects by the independent audit for the year ending June 30, 2015, the Town Manager may transfer fund balance up to the amount confirmed by the independent audit to the appropriate department(s) without further action by the Board.

WHEREAS, the recommended budget for FY 2015-16 was submitted to the Board of Aldermen on May 5, 2015 by the Town Manager pursuant to G.S. 159-11 and filed with the Town Clerk pursuant to G.S. 159-12;

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2015, the Board of Aldermen held a public hearing on the budget pursuant to G.S. 159-12;

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2015, the Board of Aldermen adopted a budget ordinance making appropriations and levying taxes in such sums as the Board of Aldermen considers sufficient and proper in accordance with G.S. 159-13;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO, NORTH CAROLINA:

Section 1. The following amounts are hereby appropriated for the operation of the Town of Carrboro and its activities for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016, according to the following schedules.

SCHEDULE B – CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

Fund Balance Appropriated \$176,945

Section 3. Pursuant to GS 159-13.2, the Board of Aldermen may authorize and budget for capital projects and multi-year special revenue funds in its annual budget or project ordinance. The project ordinance authorizes all appropriations necessary for the completion of the projects.

Section 4. Charges for services and fees by Town Departments are levied in the amounts set forth in the Miscellaneous Fees and Charges Schedule.

Section 5. The following authorities shall apply:

- a. The Town Manager can transfer funds between departments and functions within the General Fund for pay adjustments; service level benefits; law enforcement separation allowance; unemployment insurance; retiree, dependent, and permanent part-time health benefits; and, other purposes deemed necessary by the Town Manager without further action by the Board.
- b. The Town Manager can transfer funds within functions.

- c. When unassigned fund balance exceeds 35% in the General Fund, the Town Manager, in accordance with the Town fiscal policy, may set aside an amount in assigned fund balance for transfer to the capital projects fund for future projects.
- d. All operating funds encumbered or designated within fund balance for project expenditures as confirmed in the annual June 30, 2015 audit shall be re-appropriated to Fiscal Year 2015-16 Adopted Budget without further action by the Board.
- e. The Finance Officer may approve intradepartmental transfer requests between appropriation units and between programs or organizational units within the departmental budget.
- f. Transfers between Funds may be authorized only by the Board of Aldermen.
- g. The Orange County Tax Collector, is authorized, empowered, and commanded to collect the 2015 taxes set forth in the tax records filed in the office of the Orange County Tax Assessor, and in the tax receipts herewith delivered to the Tax Collector, in the amounts and from the taxpayers likewise set forth. Such taxes are hereby declared to be a first lien upon all real property of the respective taxpayers in the County of Orange. This section of the ordinance shall be a full and sufficient authority to direct, require, and enable the Orange County Tax Collector to levy on and sell any real or personal property of such taxpayers, for and on account thereof, in accordance with law.
- h. Under GS143-64.32, architectural, engineering, and surveying services with fees less than thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) may be exempt from the RFQ (Request for Qualification) process.

Section 6. There is hereby levied the following rates of tax on each one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation of taxable property as listed for taxes as of January 1, 2015 for the purpose of raising the revenue constituting the general property taxes as set forth in the foregoing estimates of revenue and in order to finance the foregoing appropriations.

Section 7. In accordance with G.S. 159-13, a copy of this ordinance shall be filed with the Town Manager, the Finance Officer, and the Town Clerk.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING CHANGES TO TOWN OF CARRBORO POSITION CLASSIFICATION AND PAY PLAN

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen has adopted a comprehensive position classification and pay plan for the Town of Carrboro;

WHEREAS, the Town Manager has submitted a budget for FY 2015-16 with proposed changes to the Position Classification and Pay Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO RESOLVES:

Section 1. The Position Classification and Pay Plan is hereby modified as follows:

- a.One FTE Planner/Zoning Development Specialist position, Salary Grade 12, in Planning Department is eliminated.
- b.The position of GIS Technician in Planning is created as a permanent part-time position at .5 FTE at Salary Grade 10.
- c.The position of Program Support Assistant II in the Finance Department, Salary Grade 4, is increased from .5 to 1.0 FTE;
- d.The position of Staff Accountant, Salary Grade 15, is reclassified to Accounting Manager, Salary Grade 15.
- e.The position of Program Support Assistant II in Recreation and Parks, Salary Grade 4, is increased from .5 to 1.0 FTE.

Section 2. Merit Pay will not be provided to Town employees in FY 2015-16.

Section 3. All other provisions of the Position Classification and Pay Plan remain unchanged.

Section 4. The Human Resources Director shall revise the Position Classification and Pay Plan to reflect the changes in Section 1 through Section 3.

Section 5. This resolution shall become effective July 1, 2015.

Alderman Gist expressed support for Option 2 because of the possibility that homeless that are turned away from the Homestead Road location may stay near the current IFC location on Main Street and asked IFC for additional information.

Alderman Chaney requested information regarding the use of the Club Nova kitchen and asked if there was actually a need for changes. Marty Roupe, the Town's Zoning Administrator, discussed the different uses associated between Club Nova and the requested IFC kitchen. Alderman Chaney asked for further information on why there is a need for the creation of a new use.

Alderman Slade stated that he would be excited to have this service in Carrboro. He asked if the current ordinance prevents operations like the Cookery a community commercial kitchen in Carrboro.

Alderman Seils stated that he would support Option 1 and begin the process. He stated that it is inappropriate to make this conversation about IFC and asked for it to be avoided.

Alderman Haven-O'Donnell stated that she is interested in hearing more information from IFC regarding the proposed use and needs across the community prior to beginning.

CONSIDERATION OF ENO-HAW REGIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

The purpose of this agenda item was for the Board of Aldermen to consider adoption of the community's newly updated hazard mitigation plan. Adoption of a plan on a five-year update cycle is required in order for the Town to maintain its eligibility for hazard mitigation grant funds.

Trish McGuire, the Town's Planning Director, provided the staff presentation.

Alderman Slade asked for information on why hurricanes are considered negligible threats and asked why information wasn't included on the financial impact of previous hurricanes in Orange County. He encouraged staff to begin the flood management plan with the use of the ongoing conversations with this plan. He suggested that the plan mention why climate change isn't included in more of the plan. He asked that the Public Works Department be included in the flood plain listing.

Alderman Haven-O'Donnell asked for information on wildfire plans in the Duke Forest and Carolina North. Interim Fire Chief Rusty Styons explained the mutual planning effort regarding wildfire plans. She asked that the Town's energy efficiency measures be shown as mitigation and in a proactive way.

Alderman Slade stated that he will work on language to add to the Hazard Mitigation and provide a resolution at the next meeting of the Board.

This item was postponed until June 23, 2015.

MINOR MODIFICATION TO CAROLINA CAR WASH CUP

The purpose of this item was to allow the Board of Aldermen to consider a request for a Minor Modification to the existing Carolina Car Wash CUP to add a detail bay garage door to the northern elevation while making upgrades to the remaining elevations.

Jeff Kleaveland, the Town's Zoning and Development Specialist, made the presentation.

Alderman Slade asked for the applicant to explore alternatives to tearing down the trees.

A motion was made by Alderman Gist, seconded by Alderman Chaney, that this resolution be approved.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A MINOR MODIFICATION TO THE CAROLINA CARWASH CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT PROJECT AT 426 E. MAIN STREET ALLOWING FOR CHANGES TO THE SITE PLAN AND BUILDING ELEVATIONS

WHEREAS, the Carrboro Board of Aldermen approved a Conditional Use Permit for the Carolina Carwash Conditional Use Permit in 1999, which was further modified in 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro wishes to support business and commercial uses in the downtown; and

WHEREAS, Town Staff has determined that this request constitutes a Minor Modification to the Conditional Use Permit; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has met the criteria in the Town's Land Use Ordinance related to Minor Modifications.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Carrboro Board of Aldermen that the Minor Modification to the Carolina Carwash Conditional Use Permit authorizing the revisions to the site plan and building elevations be approved subject to the following stipulations:

That the following additional CUP conditions are hereby added:

1. That based upon the property owners written request for flexibility in administration of the parking provisions of the LUO, the applicant be allowed to deviate from the 44 space presumptive parking standard by providing 11 parking spaces on-site and 14 satellite spaces located on the owner's other property located about 400' away at 109 Merritt Mill Rd.

2. That prior to building permit approval, the proposed site plan for this CUP Modification be revised to remove the NCDOT satellite parking spaces from parking count.

3. That signage on the building be provided directing users to the location of the bicycle parking.

4. That, based upon materials presented by the applicant at the meeting and their own request, the LUO nonconformities pertaining to sidewalk width, screening, and tree shading be allowed to remain.

5. That the applicant obtain permission from the adjacent property owner for any off-site tree removal made necessary by the installation of the retaining wall.

6. That flexibility be allowed in the layout and design of the solid waste facilities in order to protect the 48" oak tree in the southeast corner of the property. Such flexibility could include but not be limited to removal of the slab requirement in the solid waste/recycling area and/or separating the dumpster and recycling facility locations. Such arrangements would be subject to approval by Orange County Solid Waste and The Town Public Works Department.

7. That prior to building permit approval, the proposed site plan for this CUP Modification be revised to reflect the flexibility granted in the solid waste and recycling facilities on this site in order to protect the existing 48" oak in the southeast corner of the site.
