ACCEPTANCE OF FLOOD MITIGATION ASSISTANCE GRANT FUNDS -AUTHORIZATION TO SIGN GRANT AGREEMENTS

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The purpose of this agenda item was for the Board of Aldermen to accept Federal Emergency Management Agency Hazard Mitigation Grant funds to apply to the acquisition of two repetitive loss properties and the elevation of two other repetitive loss properties in the Plantation Acres neighborhood.

HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM PROJECT ORDINANCE Ordinance No. 2/2016-17

WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro (Town) has been awarded grants in the amount of \$742,477.00 by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) under its Hazard Mitigation Grant Program; and,

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management, is the agency/grantee responsible for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program; and,

WHEREAS, the grant funds are to be used for the acquisition or elevation of certain flood prone properties in the Town as described in the grant applications; and,

WHEREAS, the grant requires non-federal matching funds in the amount of \$185,619; and,

WHEREAS, North Carolina Hazard Mitigation funds have been identified to cover 100 percent of the non-federal required match; and,

WHEREAS the Board of Aldermen for the Town deems these activities to be worthy and desirable undertakings; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen for the Town accepts these grant awards and authorizes the Town Manager to execute Grant Agreements and any other required documents for the awards; and,

NOW, THEREFORE PURSUANT TO N.C.G.S 159-13.2, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO THAT:

These grants are authorized for Flood Mitigation of flood prone properties and are hereby authorized to be undertaken until all project activities are completed.

RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS - PRIORITIZATION 4.0

The purpose of this agenda item was for Board of Aldermen to consider endorsing three regional bike-ped transportation projects.

Alderman Haven-O'Donnell stated that she would like for the bike-ped project on Seawell School Road be completed and asked how to get this project on the schedule. Alderman Seils stated that this project is in the jurisdiction of the Town of Chapel Hill and that he would check with the MPO to get an update.

Tina Moon stated that the projects shown on the resolution have been submitted because they see them as scoring well and seem to have promise of being funded.

A motion was made by Alderman Haven-O'Donnell, seconded by Alderman Gist, that this resolution be approved.

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the Town has had a longstanding interest in bicycle and pedestrian improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Town submitted seven bike-ped projects to the SPOT 4.0 transportation prioritization process for funding in the 2018-2027 State Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, three of these projects appear to be strong candidates for funding:

- •Construction of bike-ped improvements to Estes Drive (SPOT ID B150621)
- •Installation of a segment of sidewalk along the north side of Jones Ferry Road (SPOT ID B150153)
- •Installation of a sidewalk along one side of Barnes Street (SPOT ID 150194); and

WHEREAS, all three projects will require a 20-percent local match, estimated at approximately \$212,761 for Estes Drive, \$112,217 for Jones Ferry Road, and \$58,226 for Barnes Street.

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NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carrboro Board of Aldermen supports the allocation of DCHC-MPO points toward these three projects and directs its representatives to convey this support to the MPO Board

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TOWN COMMONS FINAL DESIGN AND AUTHORIZATION TO SEEK CONSTRUCTION BIDS

The purpose of this item was to request Board of Alderman approval for the final Town Commons design and provide authorization to seek construction bids.

JD Freeman, the Town's Public Works Director, made the staff presentation.

Alderman Gist asked if the existing fence will remain behind the newly installed bathrooms. JD Freeman stated that the fence will remain and that the bathroom will not be open 24/7.

JD Freeman noted that the pavers will most likely be plastic and will be slightly exposed. He stated that the parking area will be pervious pavement. He also clarified that the staging will be temporary and that need to be rented since the Town does not own a stage.

Alderman Slade pointed out that the 90 degree parking redesign has taken away some greenspace.

Mayor Lavelle asked if the irrigation system will use reclaimed water. Alderman Gist asked if the rain barrels can be used for irrigation. JD Freeman stated that in the future reclaimed water will be investigated but that the rain barrels do not supply enough water to keep the sod alive.

Alderman Chaney suggested that the Crepe Myrtles be reduced in number and more canopy trees installed.

Alderman Slade stated that he would like to hold the town to the same standard for shade trees over the parking areas that they do to any outside developer. JD Freeman stated that planning staff have provided an ordinance review to ensure that the trees meet the requirements.

JD Freeman noted that the proposed Phase II of the project that would have changed the alignment of Laurel Avenue has been removed but will be reviewed by NCDOT for possible consideration by the town in the future.

Alderman Seils asked why debt financing is not an option for this project. David Andrews, the Town Manager, stated that it is not a typical capital project and that is the major reason behind the choice of financing.

Alderman Chaney asked for the amount of revenue that comes from the rental of Town Commons. Anita Jones-McNair, the Town's Recreation and Parks Director, stated that she can provide those numbers at a later time. Alderman Chaney stated that it may change the way the bank looks at the land if it is revenue generating.

Alderman Chaney asked if the CTDA funds can pay for any of the capital improvements. David Andrews stated that he will look into this.

Alderman Gist asked if this will also be an issue with funding for MLK Park. David Andrews stated that staff are investigating the best way to finance all projects.

Mayor Lavelle opened the public hearing.

Erin Jobe, representing the Carrboro Farmers Market, stated that they are thrilled with seeing the project go forward. She stated that all of the staff members have been incredible to work with and have taken

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into account their needs. She stated that this project will allow the Farmers Market to be viable for years down the road. She also introduced LaShauna Austria the new Farmers Market Manager.

The public hearing was closed.

CAPITAL PROJECT ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE USE OF FUND BALANCE FOR TOWN COMMONS IMPROVEMENTS Ordinance No. 3/2016-17

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen adopted Project Ordinance No. 17-2014-15, Design of Town Commons Capital Project Ordinance, FY 2015-16; and,

WHEREAS, the construction design has been completed and the project is ready to bid out for construction; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen for the Town of Carrboro has adopted a Fund Balance Policy; and,

WHEREAS, the adopted Fund Balance Policy provides that when the unassigned fund balance exceeds 35% the Town Manager may assign some or all of the amount above 35% for transfer to the Capital Projects Fund for future projects; and,

WHEREAS, the Town's annual audit at June 30, 2015 confirmed that the fund balance exceeds 35%; and

WHEREAS, the Town Manager has assigned an amount of fund balance above 35% for future capital project purposes; and

WHEREAS, the adopted Fund Balance Policy requires formal action by the Board of Aldermen to commit the use of fund balance for projects or purposes in any current year or future year's budget;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO THAT:

CONSIDERATION OF AN AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUNDING REQUEST FROM COMMUNITY HOME TRUST (CHT)

The purpose of this item is for the Board to consider a request for funding out of the Affordable Housing Special Revenue Fund from Community Home Trust.

Nate Broman-Fulks, an assistant to the Town Manager, made the staff report.

Alderman Slade asked about the model that would allow the owner to sell at market value. Nate Broman-Fulks explained that it is a different mechanism that is outside of the Community Home Trust (CHT) inventory but stated that this purchase would bring it to the CHT model.

Robert Dowling, the Director of the CHT, explained that this model is an example of Orange County placing deed restrictions without being in the CHT program. He explained that this model takes half of the equity from the owner. He stated that the intent of the existing financing model was to keep the property affordable.

Alderman Chaney asked how long ago the request was made to Orange County Home Consortium for funding. Robert Dowling stated that Nate Broman-Fulks has been working with Orange County for approval and that the request was submitted on August 11, 2016.

A motion was made by Alderman Gist, seconded by Alderman Johnson, that this resolution be approved.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A REQUEST FOR GRANT FUNDS OUT OF THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING SPECIAL REVENUE FUND FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACQUISITION

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WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen on, June 27, 2007, by the adoption of resolution no. 244/2006-07 created the Affordable Housing Special Revenue Fund; and

WHEREAS, the creation of the fund is another way in which the Board can advance its goal of increasing and maintaining the stock of affordable housing within the Town and its planning jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Affordable Housing Special Revenue Fund was also designed to provide funding for the acquisition of affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, Community Home Trust has requested funding from the Affordable Housing Special Revenue Fund for affordable housing acquisition; and

WHEREAS, total subsidy requested is up to \$20,000; and

WHEREAS, Town Staff has reviewed the request and determined that it meets the criteria set forth in the Affordable Housing Special Revenue Fund and the Affordable Housing Goals and Strategies; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO:

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen approves the grant to Community Home Trust in the amount of up to \$20,000.

Section 2. The Board of Aldermen authorizes the Town Manager to develop and execute an agreement as necessary to carry out the Board's action.
