APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCIL MEMBER GIST, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER HAVEN-DONNELL, TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM MARCH 31, 2020. VOTE: AFFIRMATIVE ALL.

PERMIT EXTENSION REQUEST FOR PREVIOUSLY ISSUED CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR VERIDIA AIS

Town of Carrboro Page 1 April 14, 2020

The Town Council was asked to consider approving a request for an extension of the date when a Conditional Use Permit would otherwise expire for Veridia AIS CUP. Town staff recommended approval of the request.

David Bell, the owner of the property, answered questions from the Town Council and stated that it is his goal to continue to work with the Town as a partner to build the project as affordable housing and to not displace the current residents without having a home for them.

A motion was made by Council Member Gist, seconded by Council Member Foushee, that the following resolution be approved:

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN EXTENSION OF THE DATE ON WHICH A CUP WOULD OTHERWISE EXPIRE FOR VERIDIA AIS CUP

WHEREAS, the Carrboro Board of Aldermen (renamed as Carrboro Town Council on December 3, 2019) approved a Conditional Use Permit for the Veridia AIS CUP on April 26, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Carrboro Board of Aldermen approved an extension to the date on which the Conditional Use Permit for the Veridia AIS CUP would have expired, thereby extending the date to April 26, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds, per Section 15-62(c) of the LUO, that: 1) the CUP has not yet expired, 2) the permit recipient has proceeded with due diligence and in good faith, and 3) conditions have not changed so substantially as to warrant a new application.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Carrboro Town Council that the permit is again extended, with a new expiration date for Veridia AIS CUP of April 26, 2022.

EAST MAIN STREET RESTRIPING PLAN: PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY AND PROPOSED DESIGN MODIFICATIONS

The purpose of this agenda item was to provide the Council with a summary of the public feedback received for the proposed East Main Restriping and to discuss possible minor modifications to the design based on feedback received.

Zach Hallock made the staff report and answered questions from Council Members.

Chief Horton stated that he had previously had concerns regarding the project, but after speaking with Zach Hallock he was comfortable with the proposal.

There were no comments provided from members of the public during the meeting but emailed comments were taken into account and considered for this resolution.

A motion was made Council Member Seils, seconded by Council Member Gist, that the following resolution be approved:

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE PROPOSED MODIFICATIONS TO THE PAVEMENT MARKINGS ON E MAIN STREET

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) is currently scheduled to resurface East Main Street in the summer of 2020;

WHEREAS, a traffic analysis and conceptual pavement marking plan was developed to determine the feasibility of reducing the number of automobile lanes from 4 to 3 in order to add bicycle lanes and other modifications;

WHEREAS, on April 6th, NCDOT approved the proposed modifications and is requesting a letter of support from the Town; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Carrboro Town Council that the Council is supportive of the proposed pavement marking changes and direct staff to draft a letter of support to submit to NCDOT.
