This meeting was held via Zoom teleconference and broadcasted live on cable television and the internet.

RESOLUTION – NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH

Council Member Barbara Foushee read a resolution to highlight National Mentoring Month. Special guests on hand to accept the resolution were Atrayus Goode, President and CEO of Mentor North Carolina and Lorie Clark, representing the Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools Blue Ribbon Mentor-Advocate Program.

A motion was made by Council Member Foushee, seconded by Council Member Haven-O'Donnell, that the following resolution be approved:

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH

WHEREAS, January 2022 marks the 20th anniversary of National Mentoring Month, an annual campaign to focus attention on the need for mentors and on how each of us can work to increase the number of mentors to help ensure positive outcomes for young people;

37 WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro honors volunteer mentors who support young people by
38 showing up for them every day and demonstrating their commitment to helping them thrive;
39 and

40 WHEREAS, mentoring programs like MENTOR North Carolina and the Chapel Hill-
41 Carrboro City Schools Blue Ribbon Mentor-Advocate program make our communities
42 stronger by driving impactful relationships that increase social capital for young people and
43 provide invaluable support networks; and

44 WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, mentoring programs have stepped up to fill
45 gaps for young people and families, connecting them with resources and ensuring that
46 mentoring relationships continue virtually to ensure that physical distancing does not mean
47 social disconnection; and

48 WHEREAS, mentoring plays a pivotal role in career exploration and supports workplace
49 skills by helping young people set career goals, equips mentors with the skills they need to
50 support the professional growth of young people, and drives positive outcomes for young
51 people and businesses; and

52 WHEREAS, quality mentoring promotes healthy relationships and communication, positive
53 self-esteem, emotional well-being, and growth of young people and their relationships with
54 other adults; and

55 WHEREAS, students who meet regularly with mentors are more than 52 percent less likely
56 than their peers to skip a day of school, and youth who face an opportunity gap but have a
57 mentor are 55 percent more likely to be enrolled in college than those who did not have a
58 mentor; and

59 WHEREAS, youth who meet regularly with their mentors are 46 percent less likely than their
60 peers to start using drugs and 27 percent less likely to start drinking; and

61 WHEREAS, almost half of adults today report having a mentor in their youth, and those rates
62 appear to have been rising steadily over the past several decades, and

63 WHEREAS, National Mentoring Month is a time of year to celebrate, elevate, and encourage
64 mentoring across our state and recruit caring adult mentors in Carrboro;

65 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Council of the Town of Carrboro,
66 North Carolina, hereby recognizes January 2022 as National Mentoring Month in Carrboro
67 and encourages residents to celebrate mentoring throughout the community.
